They are gathering items in a spare room at church and are willing to come over and pick up anything you no longer want that might be able to be sold in the garage sale. They will help move and transport any items you have and relieve you of the stress of dealing with it.

So, why not give one of the youth a call and set-up a day to move out that stuff! You can also arrange to drop items off at the school during church office hours if you want to haul it yourself. Please donate items that are thrift store friendly. Be mindful that larger electronics (Older model Televisions Boxed sets, for example) may not be suitable for a garage sale due to Environmental Hazard protections. Here are a few tips for donating:

Clothing

Clothing should be clean, free of stains, tears, and strong odors. You can consider whether you would give the item to a friend or family member.

Furniture

Furniture should be structurally sound and free of significant stains or tears.

Electronics

Electronics should be in working order and free of exposed wiring.

Appliances

Appliances should be in working order and free of missing knobs or buttons.

Hazardous items

Avoid donating household hazardous waste, such as cleaners, paint, and fluorescent light bulbs.

Seasonality

Consider donating items during the appropriate season. For example, you might donate snowsuits in the fall and golf clubs in the spring. This will be a Warm Weather event.
